# Function:

The Graduate Professional Assistant for Fraternity and Sorority Life is a 20-hour per week graduate assistantship in Student Involvement which is housed in the Division of University Life at George Mason University. As a member of the Student Involvement team, the Graduate Professional Assistant for Fraternity and Sorority Life reports directly to the Assistant Director of Student Involvement for Fraternity and Sorority

Life. Through advisement and event support, the Graduate Professional Assistant for Fraternity and Sorority Life promotes the development of community at George Mason University and enhances students' affinity for the institution.

# **Required Skills/Qualifications:**

- Must be enrolled in at least 6 credits in one of George Mason University's Graduate Programs for the Fall 2025 – Spring 2026 academic year (with preference giving to students in the MA Higher Education Program).
- Prior experience with leadership development, program planning, student organizations, and/or assessment and benchmarking techniques.
- Must be reliable, responsible, self-motivated, confident, sincere, flexible, dedicated, and considerate.
- Excellent written, verbal, and interpersonal skills.
- Ability to work in a high-paced, dynamic office atmosphere.
- Must exhibit professionalism and a strong work ethic.
- Must be able to join our team on August 11, 2025.
- Availability to work nights and weekends.

# Position Responsibilities

- Co-Advise one of the four Fraternity & Sorority Life Councils (Interfraternity Council (IFC), College Panhellenic Council (CPH), National Pan-Hellenic Council (NPHC), United Greek Council (UGC), meet with council Executive board members on a regular basis, and attend the weekly council meetings and council executive board meetings;
- Through the Chapter Coaching Model, provide in-depth advisement to fraternity/sorority chapters as designated by the Assistant and Associate Director;
- Develop and execute Founders Friday monthly community-wide service projects;
- Co-facilitate the Fall and Spring FSL Leadership Retreats;
- Conduct chapters academic improvement meetings with organizations that fall below community academic standards;
- Assist in facilitating required FSL workshops/presentations (Social Event Management, Hazing Prevention, etc.);
- Serve as advisor for the Order of Omega National Honor Society and Executive Board;
- Develop and execute community-wide bi-weekly newsletter and officer specific newsletters
- Work with Assistant Director on developing and implementing Community-Wide events.
- Provide support for Fraternity & Sorority Life programs (e.g., Glance into Greek, New Member Education, NPHC Step Show, Greek Week, Standards of Excellence, Panhellenic Formal Recruitment, etc.);
- Be an active member on committees within the Student Involvement office and University Life as needed;
- Provide support to other areas of Student Involvement (i.e. Programming, Student Organizations, & Fraternity and Sorority Life) when needed;
- Perform other duties as assigned by the Assistant Director for Fraternity and Sorority Life and/or the Associate Director of Student Involvement.

# **Time Commitments:**

The Graduate Professional Assistant position is designed for a 20-hour per week work commitment. At times, the work may require extended hours and/or night and weekend work hours.

# Compensation:

- The Graduate Professional Assistant position will be paid a stipend of:
  - $\circ$  \$20,577, will be paid on the 1st and 16th of the month for the duration of employment contract

period;

- Other terms for the position contract include:
  - Tuition grant up to the 6 graduate credits at the *equivalent* in-state rate, not to exceed \$4,800.00 per semester; master's degree students (with exception of MFA students) who are out-of-state do *not* receive in-state tuition rates;
  - o Participate in the University Life Graduate Staff Academy each month, as class schedule allows;
- The GPA position is a 9.5-month contract ranging from August 10, 2025 May 24, 2026, with the possibility of renewal for a second academic year;
